

CADIZ (Spain)

CAD08 – PANORAMIC TOUR | Duration: approx. 2 hours

Since the Discovery of America, Cádiz – the oldest inhabited city in Europe – has been a gateway to the New World, and a bridge between Europe and Africa. This tour will allow us to see the best places of the city from the comfort of our bus. Departing from the port, the tour starts in Paseo Marítimo overlooking the Atlantic Ocean. The tour continues through the centre of the city, where we arrive at the Cathedral to stop, take some pictures, and have free time to explore the streets around the Cathedral. We will then continue to Playa Caleta and the Castle of Santa Catalina, erected in the 17th century. The tour continues through Alameda Park and through Genovese Park, one of the most beautiful in the city. Here we will stop again for some pictures before continuing to Plaza de España, created at the beginning of the 20th century. On the way back to the port we will pass by the City Hall, built in two distinct periods; the main building in neoclassical style section dates from 1799, and the second section from 1861, which reflects the architectural style of Old Cadiz, in a period of great artistic splendour.

CAD07 – CADIZ WALKING TOUR | Duration: approx. 2.5 hours

Arguably, the best way to discover Cadiz is walking. This guided tour starts next to the port in the famous “Plaza de España” and continues by “Plaza de la Mina”, by the façade of the Museum of Cádiz and by “Calle Ancha” where we stop to admire the 19th century palaces. We will then pass by the beautiful square of “San Juan de Dios”, located by the sea and with its magnificent marble fountain. Continuing to the town plaza and the Cathedral for an outdoor visit. We will then have some free time to walk around the city until the time to return to the cruise.

Note: this tour includes walking on uneven surfaces and is not appropriate for passengers with mobility difficulties.

CAD04 – PANORAMIC TOUR AND FLAMENCO SHOW | Duration: approx. 3.5 hours



A spectacular panoramic tour of Cádiz, the oldest city in Europe West, awaits us, passing through the most beautiful squares of the city, its most important buildings, and historical monuments. The city has also an ancient Roman Theatre, 18th century Watchtower and remains of the ancient wall that surrounded the old city. You will be able to visit the Cathedral of Cádiz, a fascinating building that mixes several architectural styles, from Baroque to Rococo and Neoclassical elements that together form a mesmerizing blend of beauty. We'll save the best for last, because you'll have the possibility to attend a Flamenco Show before returning to the ship. It is demonstration of traditional Andalusian dance is the perfect way to end our tour.

Note: in case of religious celebrations, the guide will provide information about the cathedral outside. Participants will visit the cathedral at their own expense. Visitors must wear appropriate clothing for visiting sacred and religious sites. This tour includes a walk of approximately 80 minutes. Passengers with reduced mobility must assess their physical condition before booking the excursion. Passengers with any type of food intolerance must inform the tour desk no later than 48 hours before the tour.

CAD11 – SEVILLE | Duration: approx. 8 hours, lunch included



After leaving the Port of Cádiz, a 2-hour journey will take us to Seville and our first stop: the impressive Gothic Cathedral, the third largest church in the world. Our tour continues through the “Barrio de Santa Cruz”, the Jewish quarter of Seville, known for its picturesque narrow streets and characteristic courtyards of the city. Next stop will be Alcazar, a former Moorish Fortress that was once the residence of the Spanish Royal Family and it is now a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Finally, we will visit Maria Luisa Park and Plaza de España, with its wonderful pavilions built to house the 1929 Latin American Exposition. This tour includes a delicious lunch at a local restaurant.

Note: If for some reason it is impossible to visit the Alcazar or the Cathedral, these visits will be replaced by Casa de Pilatos. The final itinerary will be informed on board. As this tour involves walking on hilly streets in the Barrio de Santa Cruz and due to the many steps to go up and down in the Cathedral, this tour is not recommended for passengers with mobility difficulties. Visitors must wear appropriate clothing to visit sacred and religious sites. Passengers with any type of food intolerance should notify the ticket desk excursions a maximum of 48 hours before the tour.

BARCELONA (Spain)

BCN02 – PANORAMIC TOUR AND SHOPPING | Duration: approx. 4.5 hours



The fabulous city of Barcelona deserves a visit, and this tour will take us to the essential points of the Condal City. After leaving the Port of Barcelona, our tour begins with a climb to Mount Montjuic where we will have a privileged panoramic view over the city. We continue through the streets and squares from the city where we will have a brief stop to appreciate the Sagrada Familia, the famous unfinished cathedral, designed and idealized by Gaudí. We will have time to pass the impressive Cathedral of Barcelona built between the 13th and 15th centuries.

Finally, we'll head to Plaza de Catalunya where we'll make a stop for shopping at the many stores in the vicinity. If for some reason it is not possible to stop at Plaza de Catalunya, we will then go to Porta del Àngel.

Note: on public holidays or Sunday afternoons, the shopping stop will be carried out in the Ramblas area. Due to restrictions with car traffic in the Sagrada Familia area, the bus will stop about 10 minutes away.

BCN57 – THE BEST OF BARCELONA & PUEBLO ESPAÑOL | Duration: approx. 4.5 hours



Take some time to discover the beautiful city of Barcelona on this tour. The experience starts at the spectacular Cathedral de la Cruz Sagrada y Sta. Eulalia, whose construction began in the 13th century and lasted until the 15th century. The Cathedral is situated in the picturesque Gothic quarter, the medieval centre of the city, virtually intact. The bus will also pass by «the most famous buildings designed by Gaudí, Casa Batlló, Casa Milà and the extraordinary Sagrada Familia. At the end of the tour, we will go to Pueblo Español, a traditional village built with the purpose of showing the visitor the different architectures of Spain. As Pueblo Español is located on Mount Montjuic, we will also stop to have a panoramic view over the city before returning to the ship.

Note: If the Cathedral is closed due to a special event, the visit will be made from outside. Visitors must wear appropriate attire for visits to sacred and religious sites. This tour is not recommended for passengers with reduced mobility. Due to car traffic restrictions near the Sagrada Familia, the bus will be parked about 10 minutes from the Cathedral.

BCN37 – PANORAMIC OF BARCELONA, MONTSERRAT & WINE TASTE | Duration: approx. 7 hours, lunch not included



Celebrated around the world for its fabulous architecture, we'll explore the city of Barcelona as the bus guides us through the streets of this city, in a Catalan experience that will last the whole day. We will pass by the Passeig de Gràcia, one of the most emblematic avenues in Barcelona, also for Gaudí's unfinished masterpiece, the Sagrada Familia. Leaving behind this wonderful basilica, we'll continue to another absolutely inspiring place: the jagged sandstone mountains of Montserrat, and the abbey of Santa Maria de Montserrat, an impressive group of religious buildings with breath-taking views fabulous over the valley. Montserrat is a Catholic pilgrimage site, as well as a popular place of religious retreat, and in its Cathedral, you can appreciate the richly decorated interior as well as the Black Virgin. We will have time to visit and have lunch (lunch not included) before continuing our journey to Village of Sant Sadurni and the Vilarnau Cellars. Here we will have the possibility to see how wine is made, as well as the famous sparkling wine. At the end of the visit we will also have the opportunity to do a wine tasting. Return to our ship at the end of the day is way more relaxed.

Note: The Guide will provide explanations on the outside of the Monastery; visitors will later visit the interior in a freeway. Clothing is required suitable for visits to religious sites. This excursion is not recommended for passengers with mobility difficulties. Passengers with any type of food intolerance must report to the ship's excursion desk within 48 hours before the tour. Lunch is not included in the tour price. It is tour includes a journey of approximately 30 minutes each way in winding mountain road. The visit to the cellar may have to be carried out in the morning for logistical reasons.

BCN45 – GAUDI EXPERIENCE | Duration: approx. 4 hours



Don't miss the chance to immerse yourself in the fascinating world of the Spanish most famous architect - the world-famous Antoni Gaudí. After leaving the port, we start by going down the wonderful Passeig de Gràcia where we pass Casa Batlló, a fantastic building covered by thousands of small tiles. Right next to it is Casa Milà, a UNESCO World Heritage building. Continuing through Park Güell, a complex of gardens and one of the most visited places in Barcelona due to its extraordinary buildings, spectacular mosaics, and the famous tiled benches. The tour also includes a visit inside the architect's unfinished masterpiece, the famous Cathedral Neo-Gothic, the Sagrada Familia. The tour ends with a Panoramic trip back to the ship.

Note: Wheelchair passengers are welcome on this tour but have to bear in mind that it includes long periods of walking, so they should be accompanied by someone who can help to get on and off the bus as it has neither a ramp nor an elevator, and the wheelchair has to be fully collapsible. Park Güell is not fully accessible to passengers with wheelchair: there are some stairs and steps in the Dragon area, which is not wheelchair accessible. Passengers with reduced mobility are advised to assess their personal level of physical endurance. The visit to Sagrada Familia lasts approximately 30 minutes. Please note that another 30 minutes will be needed to pass the security control at the monument. As entry to the Sagrada Familia is regulated and has predetermined schedules, we recommend that all passengers be punctual at meeting points throughout the tour. Any delay at the various points of the tour may result in less free time to visit the Sagrada Familia. Due to traffic restrictions around the Sagrada Familia, the bus will stop near the monument and participants will have to walk about 10 minutes until you reach the Cathedral. Passengers must wear appropriate clothing to enter in religious places. We suggest the use of comfortable shoes. Tickets included on this tour: Park Güell and Sagrada Familia.

MALAGA (Spain)

ORIENTATION AND WALKING TOUR IN MALAGA | Duration: approx. 2 hours



Step off the ship and get acquainted with the city of Malaga on this little more intense orientation tour. We start with a panoramic tour of the city, in the comfort of our bus, including the Atarazanas market and Plaza de Toros. At the top of Mount Gibralfaro we can enjoy the wonderful views of the city and the Mediterranean, as well as the marvellous architecture of the Alcazaba, a fortified palace and the Castle of Gibralfaro. Then we accompany our guide on a walk through the city centre where we will pass by the house where Picasso was born, the ruins of the Roman theatre and the Baroque Cathedral, before returning to the ship.

Note: For this excursion, participants must be in good physical condition. This tour has several slopes and steps, including a climb of 130 meters. It is recommended to wear cool clothes and comfortable shoes, as well as such as sunscreen and water.

MAL01 – CITY TOUR | Duration: approx. 4.5 hours



Located in the south of Spain, on the Mediterranean coast, the city of Malaga is not only known for its beaches and nightlife; the city is one of the oldest in the World and the birthplace of Pablo Picasso. Our half day tour begins in the centre of the city, passing through Alameda Principal – a huge avenue flanked by leafy trees. We will visit the Cathedral which dates to the 16th century, and which is one of the most iconic examples of Andalusian Renaissance architecture, as well as the Castle of Gibralfaro.

Note: Participants on this tour must wear clothing appropriate to the visits to religious sites. If the Cathedral is closed, the visit to it will be made only from the outside. This excursion involves a moderate number of hikes, so participants should assess their physical condition before to book the tour.

GRANADA | Duration: approx. 8.5 hours (lunch not included)



Discover Granada, one of the most beautiful cities in Spain. The excursion starts with a 2.5-hour trip from Malaga to the Mirador de San Cristobal, where our exploration will begin. Follow the guide by the most famous and emblematic districts of Granada, the ALBAICIN, which is the birthplace of city and where even today we manage to recognize the Muslim tradition of Granada. This district was declared a UNESCO World Heritage Site. Following a stroll through the alleys of the district where you can see beautiful views of the Alhambra which emerges majestically from the opposite hills. At the end of the visit, you will have time free to have lunch and taste the local tapas in one of the many bars in the city, before to return to the ship.

EXCURSION TO RONDA | Duration: approx. 8 hours (lunch not included)



Ronda is about 90 Km from Malaga, via the Costa del Sol. Ronda is one of the most peculiar cities in Andalusia, not only for its Arab influence constantly present in its streets, but also throughout the cultural legacy of the city. The city is located 730 meters above sea level and has a gorge that divides the city in two. Upon arrival in the city the first point of visit will be the Almocavar Gate, an Arab structure from the 17th century. We continue our visit on foot through the Arena, dating back to the Catholic Kings period and which is considered one of the most important arenas in the country. From the Arena, we continue to the belvedere from where we can enjoy the magnificent Tagus Canyon and the Alameda gardens. Next, we'll visit Ponte Nova, which used to be a prison and today is one of the city's ex-libris.

Note: this tour includes moderate walking. Passengers with mobility difficulties are recommended to assess their fitness before booking this excursion. It is recommended the use of light clothes, comfortable shoes, and sunscreen. This excursion includes external visits to the monuments.

TANGER (Morocco)

TGR03 – CAP SPARTEL & THE CAVES OF HERCULES | Duration: approx. 4 hours



Spend a few hours off the ship discovering the best places in Tangier, on this half-day tour that starts with a short drive by bus to Cap Spartel, our first stop. Situated a little west of Tangier at an altitude of 300 meters, the Cap Spartel promontory offers us extraordinary views of the Strait of Gibraltar, the link between the Atlantic Ocean and the Mediterranean Sea. You will have time to take some pictures before continuing to the Caves of Hercules. Legend has it that Hercules rested in these caves after separating Gibraltar from Africa. After the visit, we'll continue to a hotel where a fresh drink will be waiting for us. One of the pearls of the city is our next visit, the famous Kasbah, dating back to the 5th century BC. Here you will be guided through the streets and alleys of the market, taking the opportunity to visit the fruit and vegetable markets, as well as a visit to a Berber Pharmacy where you will be introduced to local products used daily. A short bus ride to our ship is the end of this tour.

TGR02 – TÊTOUAN: THE WHITE PEARL OF MOROCCO | Duration: approx. 5 hours



Sheltered to the south and west by the peaks of the magnificent Rif and set in a valley of orange groves, meadows and pomegranates, the beautiful city of Tetouan was founded in 1307 as a military defence Fortress in response to the Portuguese invasion of Ceuta. We will leave the port for a short trip to Tetouan where we will start stretching our legs with a walk through the picturesque Medina and colourful souks, where we'll have the opportunity to do some shopping. We will also go to the Centre Bab Akla School to discover more about Moroccan crafts. In this cultural centre we will have some free time to visit and do some shopping. Finally, we will attend a traditional show where we will be presented with a traditional drink. We return at the end of the show to our ship.

Religions of Morocco | Duration: approx. 3.30 hours



We leave the port for a short trip to the magnificent Church of Santo André, a Moorish-style church, erected in 1890 in an area offered by the Sultan Hassan to Queen Victoria of England. The interior of this Anglican Church is decorated in the Fassi style, with prayers in Arabic above the altar. The extraordinary roof of the church is made with thousands of pieces of cedar wood and the chapel on the east side of the church has engravings of texts from the Koran, reminiscences of when the chapel was a minaret of a mosque that existed there. As we know it is the only catholic church in the world with verses from the Koran written on the wall. One authentic tribute to relations between Christians and Muslims, this church is also an American soldier's cemetery. Next we'll go to the Mosque in the district of Kasbah, undoubtedly one of the most beautiful in the Medina of Tangier. This mosque stands out for being the oldest in the city, with a unique octagonal minaret and a spectacular brown ceiling. We then move on to the Moshe Nahon Synagogue, one of the most beautiful in Morocco. Constructed during the 19th century by its namesake, a prominent educator and scholar from an influential Jewish family in Tangier, the synagogue is elaborately decorated in an Andalusian style, and its carved, stucco walls decorated with a repeating motif featuring ornamental embedded columns, tri-lobe arches, and Arabesques with floral and geometric motifs. Following the visit, we'll proceed on-foot for fresh drinks at the Continental Hotel.

Note: this tour is not suitable for guests using a wheelchair.

City Tour of Tangier and FANTASY Show | Duration: approx. 4 hours



Located at the northern tip of Morocco on the Strait of Gibraltar, Tangier is a city full of life, with a touch of exotic mystery, exuberant colours, and a friendly population. Designed to show you the most of this exciting city, the half-day tour begins with a walk along the Corniche, on the way to the furthest zone of the city. We stop for photos at Cap Spartel, a fascinating headland where the Mediterranean meets the Atlantic, before arriving at the Caves of Hercules. Legend has it that Hercules rested in these caves after separating Gibraltar from Africa. We continue to the Kasbah where our Moroccan experience ends with a walking tour through the narrow streets of the Medina. In this area you will have free time to visit the shops or go with your guide to an authentic Berber pharmacy.

Note: this tour is not recommended for people with a wheelchair.
